## What is 1Sky?

1Sky is a highly collaborative national campaign to ensure bold federal action to tackle global warming and create a 21st century green economy.

## How will 1Sky do it?

The 1Sky strategy, which is driven by field organizing and citizen engagement, combines hundreds of allied organizations and hundreds of thousands of climate advocates nationwide in a campaign to demonstrate a potent and visible public demand for Congress and the President to implement the 1Sky Solutions as quickly as possible.



# 1Sky Solutions

The 1Sky Solutions represent the scientific bottom line—the changes we must embrace immediately to transition to a prosperous green economy and avoid a climate crisis.

- **Create 5 million green jobs** and pathways out of poverty by rebuilding and refueling America with a comprehensive energy efficiency mobilization and immediate investments in a clean-energy infrastructure.
- **Reduce global warming pollution** at least 35% below current levels by 2020, and at least 80% by 2050, in line with the best science available. Recycle revenues from the sale of pollution allowances or carbon taxes to ensure they are equitably returned to the public to offset potential increases in energy costs, accelerate the transition to a clean energy future in the U.S. and internationally, and fund adaptation for vulnerable communities and natural systems here and abroad.
- **Re-power America by imposing a moratorium on new coal plants that emit global warming pollution** and replacing dirty fuels with 100% renewable energy.

## The Opposition

Oil and coal interests have well-heeled lobbyists in Washington, D.C., that contribute hundreds of thousands of dollars to political campaigns and spend millions on advertising. Even when our leaders want to do the right thing, they need the support of the people who care. It is up to us to build the political will to encourage our leaders to make the tough decisions we need to cut carbon emissions and build a 21st century economy built on renewable energy like wind, solar and geothermal.



## 1Sky Accomplishments

- **September 2007:** 1Sky was honored at the Clinton Global Initiative by former President Bill Clinton for our commitment to building a strong and successful climate movement in the U.S.
- **November 2007:** 1Sky allies at the Energy Action Coalition mobilized over 2,500 young leaders, representing 110 schools and every state in the country, to visit Congress and ask for support of the 1Sky Solutions. Step It Up organized concurrent actions in every state across the country with 60 members of Congress and three Presidential candidates to promote the 1Sky Solutions.

## 1Sky Allies

1Sky is reaching far beyond the environmental movement. The 1Sky campaign includes churches, civic groups, youth, elected officials and small businesses. Already more than 350 organizations and prominent individuals nationwide have signed on as allies. Organizations as diverse as CARE, Oxfam America, the Union for Reform Judaism, Green for All, the Hip Hop Caucus, the Union of Concerned Scientists, the American Council on Renewable Energy, Environment America and hundreds of others are working with 1Sky to create the groundswell needed to make bold federal climate policies a reality now. - **March 2008:** 1Sky supporters in all 50 states and over 240 congressional districts committed to visit their members of Congress and ask for bold action to tackle the climate challenge.
- **May 2008:** On Mother's Day weekend, 1Sky allies and supporters like Greenpeace organized nearly 500 local events nationwide and created murals to raise awareness about climate change and to ask Congress to protect our children and families from global warming. 1Sky volunteers delivered murals to congressional offices on Capitol Hill to call for bold action.
- **August 2008:** Almost 700 1Sky volunteers committed to visiting congressional offices or took part in public gatherings in 46 states to push for bold climate action.

- **September 2008:** Over 50,000 people participated in Green Jobs Now, a national day of action calling for an inclusive green economy. Co-produced by 1Sky, Green for All and Al Gore's We Campaign, Green Jobs Now featured 675 events in all 50 states.
- **November 2008:** Two weeks after the historic 2008 election, 1Sky, the Energy Action Coalition, and 350.org mobilized over 4,200 people in all 50 states and over 430 congressional districts to deliver thousands of welcome cards to their local congressional offices to call for Climate Leadership Now, and hundreds rallied in Washington, D.C., to send the same message to both President-elect Obama and Congress.
